What the Junior Program Offers

Our Junior Program offers the following:

- To provide a weekly instructional program for curlers ages 7 to 17
- To provide opportunities for recreational curlers to taste competitive play through Interclub play, Jeux de Québec regionals, bonspiels and house-league play
- To provide a competitive training schedule for older elite Juniors to prepare them to participate in the regionals for the Under-20 Provincial Championships
- To actively involve parents of Junior curlers in all aspects of the Junior Curling Program, including coaching, administrative roles (registration, publicity, website), fundraising and hosting
- To provide technical training to Junior coaches in order to ensure a consistent and comprehensive program for the participants
- To encourage feedback from curlers and parents in order to improve the program

New Midpoint Little Rock Rings

With the influx of new littlerockers, we will have phantom rings painted halfway down sheets 1 and 3 this year. This will allow all curlers to use the regular hacks and deliver into rings within their reach. Once these younger curlers are ready, they can graduate to the regular rings further down the sheet.

Weekly Sessions (October 15 to March 25)

Each week's session will be broken down into two 90-minute sessions, with the Little Rocks curlers and newer Big Rocks curlers in the first session, and the experienced Big Rocks curlers in the second session.

There could be some movement between groups, depending on space and levels of ability. Curlers should arrive on time for their session with **CLEAN** running shoes (or curling shoes). Shoes must **NOT** be worn in from the street. Sliders and brushes will be provided.

Again this year, we will try to stream curlers based on their desires and skill levels. For newer curlers, the 90-minute session will include warm-up exercises, practice slides, a review of the previous lesson, introduction of a new skill, practice drills and a mini-game (when possible).

The more experienced curlers will have the option to participate in short drills to reinforce particular skills and then proceed directly into game situations.

For those curlers looking for more competitive opportunities, they will be able to benefit from individual coaching to help them work on specific skills which might require correction.

We've listened to the feedback that you gave us at the end of last season and hope that these options will respond to your particular needs.

Interclub Competition *(included in fees)*

There will once again be the Interclub league this year with both Big Rocks and Little Rocks teams formed during the year to play in once- or twice-monthly games against other clubs. The idea is to involve as many different curlers as possible in this additional program. A schedule of these matches will be provided as soon as it becomes available. For those dates when we will be hosting these games, parents are encouraged to lend a hand with the post-game snacks.

Other Competition

In addition to the above Interclub league and possible house league play, Pointe Claire will participate in the annual Tim Caverly Bonspiel at Christmas on December 27, 28 and 29. (As we did last year, we will be running the "Café Lanthier Junior" canteen during the event to raise funds, and parents are encouraged to get involved.) There may be occasions to participate in other events during the season. Details will be provided as they become available.

ARCM Junior Challenge

This year, on the Thanksgiving weekend, Pointe Claire hosts the best 20 and Under curlers from the Montreal area in singles, doubles, skins and regular games. Four of our Juniors will be participating and we encourage you to come out and cheer them on.

Kids vs Parents and Pot Luck Suppers

As is our tradition with the Junior Curling program, we will hold two "Kids vs Parents" game days followed by a Pot Luck Supper upstairs in the club dining room. This year, the first one will be held on **Sunday, December 11** and second will be on the last curling day in the spring, **Sunday, March 25**. You will each be asked to bring one food item (salad, main course or dessert). Sign-up sheets will be available one month ahead of time.

Regular Schedule

The Junior Program schedule is posted on the Juniors page of the club's website (see below). It is subject to change so you should always check for updates.

Most sessions are Saturdays (1:30 to 3:00 and 3:00 to 4:30), however, due to club events during the season, some sessions are moved to Sundays (3:00 to 4:30 and 4:30 to 6:00).
